This indicates that Hosea lived in the middle to late eighth century BC (755–715 BC), making him a contemporary of the prophets Isaiah and Micah. Hosea Who he was: Hosea's covenantal marriage is torn by infidelity, but God experiences unfaithfulness from his people daily. While many of the minor prophets experienced difficult calls on their lives, Hosea lived out a metaphor in which he was called to marry Gomer, a prostitute who would consistently return to her promiscuous ways.

Who are the Minor Prophets and Why are They Important?

In the Hebrew Bible, Hosea, son of Beeri, was an 8th-century BC prophet in Israel and the nominal primary author of the Book of Hosea. He is the first of the Twelve Minor Prophets, whose collective writings were aggregated and organized into a single book in the Jewish Tanakh by the Second Temple period, forming the last book of the Nevi'im, but are broken up into individual books in Christianity. Hosea is often seen as a "prophet of doom", but underneath his message of destruction is a promise

According to the traditional order of most Hebrew Bibles, it is the first of the twelve Minor Prophets. Set around the fall of the Northern Kingdom of Israel, the Book of Hosea denounces the worship of gods other than Yahweh (the God of Israel), metaphorically comparing Israel's abandonment of Yahweh to a woman being unfaithful to her husband.
